

he ultimate adventure awaits in Rockingham County, a unique treasure map of recreation, that any outdoor enthusiast could dream of.

From rivers, to lakes, diverse trails and natural landscapes — it's here in RoCo — where visitors and residents alike can discover an outdoor oasis.

With experiences chucked full of nature's serenity, exploration, and an entertainment factor worth more than gold.

Are you looking for a roadmap to fun and adventure in Rockingham County?

Here are several guides and tips to Rock the RoCo, thanks to the hard work of the Rockingham County Center for Economic Development, Small Business, and Tourism.

ROCKINGHAM COUNTY BLUEWAYS


Every epic adventure starts with an impeccable roadmap. For future paddlers and veteran water carvers alike, the

journey starts with accessibility to 15 sections of public water paths within the Dan, Smith, Mayo and Haw Rivers.

And while these river entries create opportunities, it's Rockingham County's Blueway guide that serves as a compass for those ready to arc their paddle or direct their oar, on more than 85 miles of river access.

The RoCo Blueway Guide is the ultimate treasure map to fun and adventure on Rockingham County's

four rivers and three lakes. To download the roadmap to your next journey on the water, head to: visitrockinghamcountync.com





The Rock the RoCo guide provides river tips and safety measures for first timers and contact information for local outfitters who can provide guided trips and/or rental equipment.

The directory is broken down into color-coded pageby page travelable section guides of the regions' rivers and lakes. It displays the features of each travel section, skill level requirements, a detailed map of the float path, GPS coordinates, and map identifiers of put in and take out locations.

Each section is also labeled with trip duration information, as well as expected paddle and floating times for each designated trip.

Water fun isn't just limited to kayaking and canoe ventures on our beautiful waterways.

Kick back, relax and bask in the sun – as you enjoy a lazy river tubing adventure with family and friends, on the Dan River and beyond.

Or wake up at the break of dawn to catch the sun's orange hue at Belews Lake, Lake Reidsville and Lake Hunt. Launch your bass boat into an Angler's paradise, as all three bodies of water hold a healthy bass, crappie and bream population.

Looking instead for pure family fun?

Spend a weekend camping, boating, water skiing, bird watching and picnicking at one of Rockingham County's premiere recreation hubs.

Or head on over to Stokesdale, and enjoy swimming, tubing, paddling, boating, and jet-skiing on Belews Lake. Choices are endless on the RoCo Blueway, the perfect getaway for any adventurer who loves being on the water. And the RoCo Blueway Guide is the quintessential tool to help you





navigate your next adventure, needed rental equipment, and local accommodations.

YEAR OF THE TRAIL

This year, Rockingham County is highlighting Rockingham County's great walking, running, and biking assets, by joining in on a statewide initiative to designate 2023 as the Year of the Trail.

Nearly 600 square miles make up Rockingham County's terrain, and its 25 public trails accent its beautiful landscape. Intertwined in that beauty, is a diverse set of walking, biking and running paths, with uses for every individual.

In Mayodan, cyclists from near and far are graced with the top-rated mountain bike trail at Farris Park.

The 3.3-mile trail, rated four stars on mtbproject. com, provides natural cuts, challenging berms, snake-like

curves, and blazing fast lap times.

The racecourse has grown significantly since its inception in 2016, with regional circuits such as Greensboro-based Racing in the Woods, adding the course to its seasonal series schedules.

Since 2018, hundreds of student athletes have made their way to Farris Park to take part in the North Carolina Interscholastic Cycling League State Championships, held annually in May.

North Carolina has declared 2023 as the Year of the Trail and Rockingham County has a robust selection of recreational pathways to discover, with over

25 different public trails spread across the county.

Enjoy your opportunity to #GoWithTheRoCoFlow by visiting this diverse set of walking paths!



With courses in Climax, Wilkesboro, Salisbury and Elizabethtown on the Schedule, the peak youth development cycling program for 6th-12th grade students will make its way to Farris Memorial on April 30 and May 21, for the season finale. 62 registered various high school, middle school and composite teams from all areas of the state are already registered for both events.

Located in Mayodan NC 30 miles northwest of Greensboro, Mayo River State Park offers various recreational opportunities at the main Mayo Mountain access and at multiple accesses along the Mayo River. At the main access, visitors can enjoy hiking trails, fishing ponds, a picnic area and shelter, and a group campsite. Four accesses — Deshazo Mill, Anglin Mill, Hickory Creek, and Mayodan — allow entry to the river, home to rich wildlife and Class II rapids. Deshazo Mill also features a picturesque waterfall on Fall Creek.

The Madison River Park is located at the Dan River on Lindsey Bridge Road in Madison, N.C. The Dan River, known as the "Lazy River" is well suited for paddlers of all skill levels and is considered one of the best places to learn to paddle in North Carolina. The Dan allows you to float away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life and enjoy its relaxing pace, beautiful scenery, and historical significance.

The Dan is free flowing with few modern improvements and its waters are plentiful enough that visitors can still canoe, tube or kayak during times of drought. Thanks to the Town of Madison and several state agencies an old dam that was having several structure issues was removed and a beautiful river park was created complete with seven small rapids that are great for fishing, kayaking, tubing are just sitting back and enjoying the scenery. Historic place cards provide context to the grounds that played a key role during the American Revolution.

So many other trails such as the Knight Nature Preserve and Hogans' Creek Park in Madison, Stoneville Downtown Connector Trail, Farris Park Bike Trail are also prime examples of the different ways visitors and residents alike can discover their own trail.

OTHER WAYS TO EXPLORE RoCo AND THE GREAT OUTDOORS

As the sun shines in Rockingham County, so does the abundance of fun outdoor activities away from the rivers, lakes and trails. Guests can hit the links at any of Rockingham County's eight public golf courses.

Can't keep it straight?

Make your way to one of RoCo's disc golf venues at Farris Memorial Park in Mayodan, Lake Reidsville and Haw River State Park.

Once the sun begins to set, make your way to our downtowns for a bite to eat, at the plethora of local eateries that make Madison, Mayodan and Stoneville unique.

Cap off your evening at Gioia dell' Amore Cellars at Autumn Creek Vineyards or catch live music and local spirits at The River Club or Wandering Sun Meadery in Madison's downtown social district.

In Rockingham County, adventure awaits you with every step you take.

It flows through our rivers and floats in our lakes. It treks up mountain bike trails and breathes within our small town, adventurous pace.

Nelson took two years leave from education to be alongside Salem on every step on the road to recovery.

At a crossroads following leave, the former kindergarten and pre-k special needs instructor had to make the decision to either return to the classroom or find a new career path.

She chose retail and an opportunity to be alongside her daughter every single day.

"It was a literal God thing, it was perfect timing," said

Nelson, on the acquisition of PBJ's from longtime owner Penny Jones. "I was able to make a living and have her with me. It was bittersweet.

After buying the business, Nelson changed the name to Salem and Charlie – after her daughter and her jubilant service dog Charlie.

Today, a beautiful picture of the duo adorns the back wall behind the boutique's register.

It serves as a symbol of the love and kindness living inside the Murphy Street store that welcomes guests from near and far.

A customer base that has only grown Nelson's love for the community.

Shortly after opening, Salem and Charlie saw continued growth amongst the start of the COVID pandemic.

Customers supported through purchasing items on live broadcasts. Individuals even committed to future purchases by buying gift cards to use for future purchases, once the store reopened.

"Coming from education, I had to learn a lot about retail," said Nelson. "This whole community, the chamber, the merchant's guild, the people — they have welcomed us and supported us.

"Everyone is kind and we look out for each other," said Nelson, while praising the downtown district in Madison. "We try to send customers to each other and support the brewery, wineries, and restaurants.

"It's been phenomenal," said Nelson, "She was going to go to Liberty University to be a nurse. Of course, we had all her dorm stuff, and that was hard, but we got through it.

"When you are young like that and something happens, you feel like you're robbed of your future," said Nelson "The store is named after her and Charlie and she didn't want that to be her sole identity."

She noted that it's not always easy working with your parents and that she is beyond proud of Salem, who is forging her own path.

Yet, the power of love through adversity, in God's name, will always live in the ethos of Salem and Charlie Boutique.

It continues to motivate Marla Nelson, as she serves the Western Rockingham Community and beyond, at the beautiful little Madison boutique, across from the Mad Bean parking lot.

"She's my baby," said Nelson, holding back tears as she discussed the impact her daughter has on her day after day.

"Everything I do, I do it for her."

As for Salem and Charlie, Nelson hopes the store is still serving the community 20 years from now.

"We are very much followers of Jesus," Nelson said. "We want to be bold about sharing our faith. It's the reason we are here. We give God the glory and he's provided for us."

Salem and Charlie Boutique is located at 108 E. Murphy Street in downtown Madison and is open from 10 AM to 5 PM Tuesday Through Friday and from 9 AM to 4 PM on Saturdays.






Where Empowerment Begins Help Incorporated, Associated Agencies put Abuse Survivors

first with the opening of SquareOne Family Justice Center

WENTWORTH

t started as a goal in 2016 to bring the community a single location and united response for victims of domestic and sexual violence.

Now, thanks to the continuous efforts of local nonprofit Help Incorporated to limit survivor trauma, clients will be served more efficiently and effectively.

Rockingham County celebrates the grand opening of SquareOne Family Justice Center this spring, a 10,000-square feet facility that takes burden off victims of family violence, by providing coordinated services to victims.

For the first time under the same roof, victims of domestic violence, child abuse, elder abuse, sexual assault and human trafficking, can begin the healing process under

The new facility allows professionals from different agencies to work together under an integrated model, to

provide safety, legal, social and health services.

While Help Incorporated continues to provide advocacy, crisis intervention, shelter and therapy, tremendous community partnerships will also help lift burden from abuse victims, who routinely face complex systems on the road to healing.

Officials with supporting agencies showed support to the Family Justice Center model from the get-go, while understanding that creating the most effective support starts with multi-agency support.

Partners include the district attorney's office, clerk's office, health and human services, department of social services, district court judges, probation/department of corrections, health providers, Rockingham County Partnership for Children, county youth services, private attorneys and many other agencies.

The safe haven, located at 317 Cherokee Camp Road



in Wentworth, is constructed on land donated to Help Incorporated by the Rockingham County Government, by way of the Board of Commissioners.

It features a residential wing, three residential suites and many other safe spaces to provide comforts and necessities of everyday life.

Office spaces for organizations such as the District Attorney's Office and Department of Social Services allow for meetings and evaluations within one centralized location.

The co-located service model helps erase the complex systems that tend to fall on the victim's shoulders, despite the fear, anxiety and heartbreak they face after trauma.

Now, thanks to resources provided by the FJC, local children impacted by abuse no longer are required to travel to Brenner's Children's Hospital in Winston-Salem for evaluation.

As part of the multi-agency system, an in-house pediatrician has been added to the FJC team.

Help Incorporated Executive Director Angie Boles is proud of how hard partners worked throughout the last seven years to provide new resources and enhance others in order to improve the lives of adult and child victims.

"I always say that the stars aligned for us and our team, but all the partners worked extremely hard and I'm very proud of the way we faced barriers," said Boles, who has served as advocate for survivors since 1991.

Boles knows that with several different agencies working together under different disciplines, there will always be challenges to overcome.

Yet, when similar challenging moments arose on the road to opening SquareOne Family Justice Center, discussions always revolve around a unified will to find a way.

"It's a never give up attitude that this team has had from the get-go, that's what I'm proud of" said Boles, who began at Help Incorporated as a Shelter Director in 1994.

Boles added that divine intervention also played a role during the arduous process of building Square One FJC.

"Our Team mantra revolved around knowing that if we are doing it for the right reasons, it will happen," said Boles, who has led the Help Incorporated team for the last 19 years.

"We know that we have to keep our goal survivor focused, because they are our only reason for being."

From July 2021 to June of 2022, Help Incorporated received 878 Domestic Violence crisis line calls and served over 1,750 clients, according to data gathered by the NC Council For Woman and Youth Involvement.

During the same time period, Help Incorporated received 248 sexual assault based calls on the crisis line, and served over 490 clients.


